Project Synopsis

Description

This program provides salaries for teachers at a primary school for students from impoverished communities.

Purpose

To not only give poor children a comprehensive Christian education that would otherwise be out of reach but also introduce their families to the love of Christ through parental education workshops.

Location

Mountain communities on the outskirts of Arequipa, Peru's second-most populous city.

Cost

\$17,072 will fill the funding gap to provide full salaries for 4 teachers and a partial of a 5th out of the 16 teachers responsible for the education of at least 230 children ages 3 to 16 years old.

Highlights

- Many children in this region are malnourished and drop out of the educational system after elementary school.
- Many students come from homes where domestic violence, crime, juvenile alcoholism, neglect and abuse are common, so the program is extremely crucial to their wellbeing and future development.



These second-graders are educated in a nurturing, safe environment where they learn about God's grace, love and mercy.

- At Elohim Christian School, children are spiritually nurtured, well-fed and given a Christian education to guide them through the difficulties of living in extreme poverty.
- Director Rosa Gil and her staff aim to change children's lives by also educating their parents through sewing, cosmetology and cooking workshops where they're introduced to the Gospel. Staff hold monthly meetings with parents to provide psychological and spiritual support.
- To keep the school accessible to the poor, Elohim relies on support from Cross International to help cover the cost of teacher salaries so students may reap the tangible and spiritual benefits of a Christian education.

The Need

A Release From Oppressive Poverty

At 10,000 feet above sea level, dry, dusty Arequipa is hardly prime real estate. In fact, this barren landscape of volcanic rock is so inhospitable that no one seems to want it — except for the very poor, who have little choice about where they can live.

Impoverished indigenous families first migrated there from the countryside decades ago hoping to find a better life, but the area remains a wasteland and its prospects remain poor. This has led to a cycle of poverty and unemployment that ultimately produces neglect and abuse in many of the families who struggle to survive there.



A lack of clean water sources make subsistence farming, cooking and even taking a bath difficult tasks for Arequipa's poorest residents.

While public schools are free in Peru, most of the poorer families in the area cannot afford the cost of the transportation, uniforms and books necessary to take advantage of the service. As a result, many poor children are left out.

Fortunately, Christian leaders in the area became aware of the problem and worked to provide a better option. Today, Elohim Christian School is the result. It offers an alternative to this life of destitution by bringing Christian education and values to poor children who have never learned to read or write or study the Bible.

Eight-year-old Katalina is one of children who will benefit. A poor girl, she accompanies her mother to one of Arequipa's marketplaces to sell food and knickknacks every night.

Katalina's mother, a product of a cycle of domestic violence herself, often speaks harshly to her, and this abuse has been taking its toll. The caring staff at Elohim Christian School try their best to provide Katalina with a loving, Christian experience at school because she clearly craves adult affection.

Maria, a fourth-grader, faces similar challenges. Her cheerful and enthusiastic attitude at school belies difficult realities in her home life. Her mother is a binge drinker and often leaves her alone in a dirt-floor shanty to care for her younger brother. Maria — wise beyond her years — has a strong sense of responsibility for her little sibling and gets herself to school each day. The Elohim Christian School staff know her time there represents a respite where, for a few hours, she can be a child again, happy and carefree. The spiritual, emotional and physical nourishment she receives at Elohim gives her the strength and encouragement she needs to get through her day.

For many students, Elohim is the first place they learn about Jesus Christ, and that encounter changes their perspective and builds their sense of self-worth. That relationship with the Lord, Elohim staff members believe, is crucial to the future well-being of the students.

To continue supporting children like Katalina and Maria, the Elohim Christian School needs your help. Ministry Description

Rosa Gil, the director of Elohim Christian School, is living proof of how an education can break the bonds of poverty and change lives forever. Growing up malnourished, with an illiterate mother and an alcoholic father, she seemed trapped in a world of desperation. Like most children in impoverished parts of Peru, she expected to grow up poor — in a daily struggle to find work and to feed herself.

Fortunately, schooling offered Rosa hope. A good student, she was actually able to overcome her circumstances and eventually became a teacher so she could offer hope to children who experienced the painful hardships she endured. It was out of that desire, in fact, that the Elohim Christian School was born in 2003. Rosa taught her

first classes to slum children in a small shack of woven straw.

Today, Rosa has a building and the school educates some 230 students about God's grace, love and mercy. With help from Cross International and the American donors who support our efforts, Elohim tends to the physical needs of each child by providing a nutritious meal per day to give them fuel to learn. While many of these children still know the suffering of abuse, hunger and anxiety at times, at Elohim they are given an opportunity to laugh, play and dream about a better future — one that is actually within their grasp.

"Our desire is to educate children in the ways of God so they can improve the quality of their lives," says Rosa. "We want to teach every family to prioritize their children's

education, which will decrease the crime and drug addiction that currently occurs in the community."

The dedication of this ministry is exemplified by its Christian teachers, most of whom left better- paying public school jobs to teach at Elohim because they believe in its mission and want the area's poor students learn about the Bible and receive God's hope every day.
